

10. South Dakota

- a. Section 3(a) is modified to read as follows:

“This Policy applies to all Commitments and Certificates issued under the Policy on or after the effective date of the Policy. This Policy will remain in effect until it is cancelled. This Policy may be cancelled by the initial Insured for any reason or no reason upon 10 days’ prior notice, or by us upon not less than 20 days’ prior notice and in accordance with the provisions of the South Dakota Insurance Code, Section 58-33-61. If the Policy is cancelled, the Policy will remain in effect with respect to any Commitment or Certificate issued before cancellation, provided that all required premiums are paid.”

11. Texas

- a. It is hereby understood and agreed that we may not cancel or refuse to renew this Policy or a Certificate based solely on the fact that the Insured is an elected official.

12. Utah

- a. Section 65 is modified to read as follows:

“If you do not file a Claim by the deadline stated in Section 64, we are not obligated to include in the Claim Amount any interest accrued or Advances you paid after the deadline passed. If the Claim is submitted more than 120 days after the expiration of the deadline stated in Section 64, then we may deny the claim. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, your failure to file a Claim within the time period required under this section will not invalidate such Claim if you show that it was not reasonably possible to file the Claim within the prescribed time and that the Claim was filed as soon as reasonably possible.”

13. Limitation of Actions.

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 94 (Limitation of Actions), if upon the issuance of this Policy the principal business address of the initial Insured indicated in this Policy is governed by the law of, the state indicated below, then the following shall apply:

- a. Alaska, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, and Utah: The 2-year period described in Section 94 is extended to three (3) years.
- b. Kansas: The 2-year period described in Section 94 is extended to five (5) years.
- c. South Dakota: The 2-year period described in Section 94 is extended to six (6) years.
- d. Missouri: The 2-year period described in Section 94 is extended to ten (10) years.
